1. Conteúdo programático:

The relationship between philosophy and psychology is one of the most central matter of the history of modern philosophy. In this course post-graduate students and Ph.D. candidates will cover the key issues in modern philosophy of mind while also learning to think for themselves and develop their own answers to the core questions in this field. This course aims to analyse a central question in modern philosophy: What are the sources of knowledge? Do we really have any knowledge? What is the relationship between psychology and epistemology? This course will take into account psychological questions from Descartes, Locke, Hume, Kant to Brentano, Wundt, and 20th century philosophy of psychology.

2. Objetivos:

Offer an effective introduction to the history of modern philosophy and psychology, including epistemology, studying the most significative philosophers of this period and enhancing student's ability to enter imaginatively into rival viewpoints and diverse perspectives in the history of modern philosophy concerning different theory of mind.
